## Τί σημαίνει ἅγιοι Ἀνάργυροι

Ίδιαίτερη τάξη ἀνάμεσα σ´αὐτούς πού εὐαρέστησαν στόν Θεό ἀποτελοῦν οἱ ἄγιοι Ἀνάργυροι. Ἐνῶ ὅμως μέ τόν ὅρο αὐτόν (ἅγιοι Ἀνάργυροι) οἱ περισσότεροι χριστιανοί νοοῦν τούς ἀγιους Κοσμᾶ και Δαμιανό ἤ τούς ἀγίους Κύρο και Ἰωάννη, το σωστό εἶναι νά παραπέμπουν τή σκέψη τους σέ ὅλους ἐκείνους τούς ἀγίους, οἱ ὀποῖοι «δωρεάν ἕλαβαν καί δωρεάν ἕδιναν» τή θεραπεία σέ σωματικές καί ψυχικές ἀσθένειες, μηδέν ἄλλο πρᾶγμα γήινον λαμβάνοντες, εἱ μή μόνον μισθόν τῆς ἱατρείας ζητοῦντες τό νά πιστεύωσιν εἰς τόν Χριστόν οἱ ἱατρευόμενοι, ὅπως γράφει ὁ ἅγιος Νικόδημος ὁ Ἀγιορείτης. Ἀνάργυροι δηλαδή χαρακτηρίζονται οἱ ἅγιοι πού δέν ἕπαιρναν «ἀργύρια», χρήματα, γιά τίς θεραπεῖες πού ἕκαναν. Τό μόνο πού ζητοῦσαν ἀπ΄ ὅσους θεράπευαν ἦταν νά πιστεύουν στό Χριστό.

Καί ναί μέν ἀρκετοί ἀπό τους ἀγίους τῆς Ἐκκλησίας εἶχαν τό χάρισμα καί ἕκαναν θεραπεῖες, ὅμως ὑπῆρξαν καί ἀρκετοί ἀπ ἀὐτούς ποὐ ὄντας ἰατροί στό ἐπάγγελμα, τό ἀσκοῦσαν χωρίς ἀμοιβή, δωρεάν, λόγος γιά τόν ὁποίο ἕλαβαν τήν προσωνυμία «Ἀνάργυροι», πού ταυτίστηκε τόσο πολύ μέ τό πρόσωπο ὡρισμένων ἀπ ἀὐτοῦς, ὥστε μερικοί χριστιανοί νά νομίζουν πώς εἶνα τό ὄνομά τους.
