Excessive, habitual tardiness (+10 minutes) and/or leaving early (-15 minutes) will also have an impact on attendance; three tardies equal one absence.	
	Attendance in all classes is required. A student who will be absent for 1/3 of the school meeting dates in a given school year will not be promoted to the next level. Please keep in mind that the following school celebrations are part of school meeting dates: Greek Letters celebration, 25th of March Greek Independence, and End-of-school-year program.
